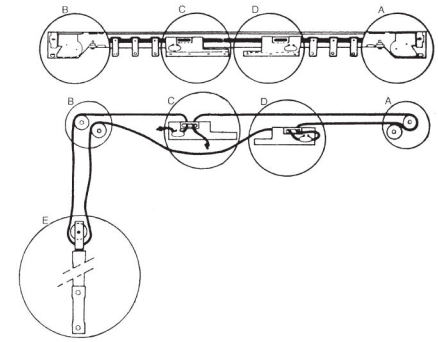


Easy step-by-step assembly guide

1. Knot cord at one end.
2. Using other end of cord, lace as follows: Feed through one hole in master-side C ... feed around top heel of pulley A ..feed through both holes of master-slide D ... feed over bottom wheel of pulley B ... feed around wheel of tension pulley E ..feed over top wheel of pulley B ... feed through the hole of masterslide C, and knot end of cord.
3. Slide both masterslides C and D onto the curtain rail.
4. Add the required number of slides to the curtain rail.
5. Clip pulleys A and B onto both ends of the curtain rail, ensuring that the cord is not twisted.
6. Fit completed rail and tension pulley to wall.
7. Adjust length of cord at master-slide C so that cord is tensioned and so that master slides C and D meet in the centre of the curtain rail.



CORDING SETS - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

1. Rollo Rail - if curtains are very light, single draw cord is acceptable on rails up to 4m length. If curtains are heavy, then single drawcord maximum 3m length. For both of above we recommend multiple cording sets for rails in excess of above lengths.
2. Chase Rail - if curtains are very light, single draw cord is acceptable on rails up to 5m length. If curtains are heavy, then single drawcord maximum 4m length. For both of above we recommend multiple cording sets for rails in excess of above lengths.
